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## Directors' report

The Companies Act 2006 requires the Directors to present a fair review of the business of Jigsaw Treasury Limited (the Company) during the year ended 31 March 2024 and of the position of the Company at 31 March 2024 together with the financial statements, auditor's report and a description of the principal risks and uncertainties which the Company faces.

#### The board

Members of the board, who served throughout the year and up to the date of approval of the financial statements, are set out on page 1.

#### **Background and principal activity**

JTL is a private company limited by shares and at 31 March 2024 was a member of the Jigsaw Homes Group Structure (the Group), of which Jigsaw Homes Group Limited was the ultimate parent company.

JTL is a wholly owned subsidiary of Jigsaw Homes Group Limited and its purpose is so that Group companies can pool assets under a form of guarantee arrangement across the group and to align financial covenants across the group. By arranging the groups treasury requirements in this way the funding capacity available to the group has strengthened significantly and underpins the group's objectives to build additional new homes.

The Company's main activity is to form a borrower group for the RP's (Social Housing Providers) in Jigsaw Homes Group and to enable the pooling of assets under a form of guarantee arrangement making for a more optimal structure and increased borrowing capacity. It will also allow Public Bond monies obtained to be onlent to the group.

The Group's main offices are in Leigh, Ashton-under-Lyne, and Manchester. The Company is a member of the Jigsaw Homes Group Structure (the Group), of which Jigsaw Homes Group Limited (JHG) is the parent company. At the year end, the Group comprised the following principal entities:

# Directors' report

#### **Principal risks and uncertainties**

Risks that may prevent the Company achieving its objectives are considered and reviewed annually by the executive management team of the Group and the board as part of the Group's corporate planning process. The Group's risk and governance model is designed so that the board maintains overall responsibility for risk.

Risks are recorded and assessed in terms of their impact and probability and are reported to the Group's Risk and Audit Committee quarterly, together with any action taken to manage those risks, including assessment of key controls and the outcome of any action.

The principal risk to JTL remains the future strategy and performance of the other Group members as new housing developers. The Group has updated its risk map and will continue to monitor developments in this area. The Group has also established a suite of performance measures which are monitored by the Board and by the Risk and Audit Committee on a quarterly basis.

#### **Directors' responsibilities statement**

The Directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law they have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with UK Accounting Standards and applicable law (UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK.

#### Report of the Independent Auditors to the Members of Jigsaw Treasury Limited

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Jigsaw Treasury Limited (the Company) for the year ended 31 March 2024 which comprises the Statement of Comprehensive Income, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Changes in Equity and the notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies in note 2. #### 1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 – 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland' ('FRS 102'), and with the Companies Act 2006.

#### **Going concern**

The company is a treasury vehicle of the Jigsaw Homes Group as such its ability to continue as a going concern is intrinsically linked to the performance of the Group.

The Group assessment is as follow:

Based on the following assessment the board is comfortable that the Company continues to be a going concern and have therefore produced financial statements on a going concern basis.

The Association's activities, its current financial position and factors likely to affect its future development are set out within the Strategic Report.

The Board approved the Association's 2024/25 budget prior to the start of the financial year and approved the Association's thirty year financial plan shortly afterwards. The board is content that these plans were affordable and that the financial statements should be prepared on a going concern basis.

The board reviewed a range of scenarios and stress tests in order to fully understand the potential impact on the thirty year financial plan and the Group's loan covenant position. This considered how alternate projections for inflation, interest rates and house prices impact on the Group's financial covenant position. The alternate projections arise from three different macroeconomic scenarios

- A central forecast based on estimates published in the Economic and Fiscal Outlook by The Office for Budget Responsibility where available and otherwise, on sector norms as advised by Centrus.
- The 2022 Bank of England stress test scenario which envisaged deep simultaneous recessions in the UK and global economies, large falls in asset prices and higher global interest rates
- A Black Swan Event which combines the worst independent ten year movements in recent memory of each macroeconomic variable into a single challenging scenario.

The stress tests also considered the materialisation of significant financial risk to the business using an assessment of the worst-case realistic potential financial impacts associated with current risks recorded in the Group's risk map. For the purposes of the stress test, the board has selected scenarios where combinations of key risks unexpectedly materialise to present either medium or long term impacts to the business.

The board continues to review the financial plan with the executive team to make any necessary changes and continue to work with our customers and stakeholders to deliver our services.

## 2 Principal accounting policies

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Companies Act 2006.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. However, the board has assessed that there are no significant estimates or judgements made in applying the Company's accounting policies.

#### **Disclosure exemptions**

The Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by the FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK":

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirements of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d);
- the requirements of Section 11 Basic Financial Instruments;
- the requirements of Section 33 Related Party Disclosures paragraph 33.7.

This information is included in the consolidated financial statements of Jigsaw Homes Group Limited as at 31 March 2024 and these financial statements may be obtained from their registered office at Cavendish 249, Cavendish Street, Ashton-under-Lyne, OL6 7AT.

#### **Turnover**

There is no turnover generated in JTL as the interest payable on the loans is recharged to the Registered Providers that benefit from the funding.

#### **Debtors**

Debtors with no stated interest rate receivable are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the income statement in other operating expenses.

#### **Creditors**

Creditors with no stated interest rate payable within one year are recorded at transaction price.

#### 3 Operating profit

The Group completed deals in December 2023 following a comprehensive treasury strategy review, focusing on enhancing liquidity and financial capacity and optimising Jigsaw's treasury operations. The deals helped grow the Group's available finance resources by over £100m. It involved increasing the tenor of Jigsaw's revolving credit facilities (RCFs), raising a £50m private placement and optimising financial covenants, whilst lowering the overall average interest margin. As part of the treasury review the Group repaid loans of £17.4m and incurred break costs which amounted to £541k. In addition, capitalised loan fees of £724k were derecognised (written off) in December 2023 following completion of the refinancing exercise. The total of both break costs and derecognised costs, amounts to £1,265k.

Where RCFs have been extended, Jigsaw has derecognised the original liabilities and subsequently recognised the costs directly relating to the extended RCFs as new liabilities which will be amortised over the life of the facilities. Eligible costs incurred in raising the new private placement have also been recognised as a new liability to be amortised over the life of the placement. All liabilities relating to the repaid loans have been derecognised in the month the repayment was made.
